MyMaths: I have set homework on the new online MyMaths program. The task is based on perimeter. Your child's log in details should be in your child's reading log.

Reading: Please do keep up with your daily reading and entering your information into your reading logs. Some question you can ask your children:

1. Can you tell me what has happened so far? 2. What do you think will happen next? 3. What type of character is..., are they kind, rude, happy, miserable, how do we know this? 4. How do you think the character feels at this point, how do you know? 5. Before reading the next page ask, what can you see happening in this picture? 6. What does word mean? 7. Can you think of another word that means the same? 8. Can you find a question mark on this page? 9. Why have they used it here? 10 What do you think will happen next? 11. How does the character feel?

Spellings: This weeks spelling have been set as a '2do' on PurpleMash. Ten Spellings will be set from the Year 4 curriculum and a further ten will recap previously covered spelling from Year 2/3. The Spelling test will be on Friday.
